EFB 15 ANNIVERSARY

September 27th in Belgrade was all about the EFB 15. The European Fund for the Balkans gathered its friends, partners, alumni, beneficiaries and collaborators from all across the Western Balkans and EU for marking its 15th year anniversary.



The panel organized in honor of the 15 years of dedicated work in and for the region included the representatives of the EFB founding partners and Foundations Franz Karl Pruler (ERSTE Foundation), Atje Drexler (Robert Bosch Stiftung), and Stefan Schafers (King Baudouin Foundation) who were joined on the stage by Florian Bieber (Balkans in Europe Policy Advisory Group), Vedran Džihić (Engaged Democracy Initiative) and Vladica Jovanović (beeEFB Alumni Network). The discussion focused on EFB's past, how it all began and developed, what were the milestones, but also the current state of play, and the changed context in which EFB functions. This occasion was a nice opportunity to gather a significant part of the EFB Alumni at the event, and the fact that the members of the previous and current beeEFB Board together with the new bees from the second edition of the beeEffect programme and the local alumni from Serbia outnumbered the other guests speaks volumes of the importance of the beeEFB network and its potential to continue to be recognized as a huge human capital which is fundamentally connected to the current and future work of the Fund.



The Launching Event of the second edition of the beeEffect Programme, which was held in Belgrade and Divčibare from September 27 to October 1st, was all about buzzing energy, ideas, peer learning, and exchange with the members of the beeEFB Alumni Network and the new bees.

5 days of mentoring sessions, lectures, and workshops, but also lots of networking and fun activities. The agenda concept was divided into 3 thematic pillars – the Future of Technology, the Future of Society, and the Future of Power, along with the introductory sessions, case studies work, and the kick-off of the immersive mentoring process.

The participants from Albania, Macedonia, Serbia, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Romania, Greece, and Croatia were introduced to the programme and the dynamic of the learning exchange and curriculum planning for the next few months, which also includes different online and offline activities.

This is just the first stop of the busy schedule of the whole beeEffect learning journey for the amazing participants from across the Western Balkans and EU, who will be partnered with their mentors and EFB alumni who have already had the chance to be part of the EFB previous programmes.



Art of Public Speech - Let it stay between us

The unique interactive cabaret is an initiative of 11 EFB alumni from Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, and Serbia will provide an opportunity for the poet and mastermind of this concept Nebojša Kuruzović to open a dialogue with his fellow EFB Alumni and the citizens about the key problems of this society. It coincides with the values recognized by EFB as well, such as political freedom, regional connectivity and reconciliation, as well as the challenges of the new digital age.



During the cabaret performance, four guests will be selected to come onstage, with a minimum of two EFB ALumni from the local city. The aim is to facilitate discussions on socially relevant topics, incorporating the perspectives of poets, EFB alumni, and ordinary citizens. Depending on the chosen topic, the guests will randomly select a song to be performed by the renowned Banja Luka jazz band "Kombine." This initiative serves to promote freedom of speech, civic engagement, and public awareness of diverse viewpoints. The cabaret events are scheduled in three cities: Sarajevo, Skopje, and Belgrade, and everyone is encouraged to check the event calendar and attend to support the organizing alumni group.

Training on the "Theory of System Change" is a comprehensive program designed to equip individuals and organizations with the knowledge and tools needed to drive meaningful societal impact and create lasting change. The training delivered by Chrysa Petala and the team from Amon.gr various essential covers aspects, including defining the organizational direction, systemic change theory. identifying target groups and needs, translating goals into action, strategic partnerships and sustainability and alliance with "competitors" among others. This training equips participants with a holistic understanding of creating



positive societal change. It emphasizes clarity of purpose, strategic planning, collaboration, and adaptability as essential elements in navigating complex social challenges and working towards a better future.

Being an EFB alumni makes you a member of the wider <u>Bosch Alumni Network</u> (BAN). It provides many opportunities to be engaged or participate in a global community of over 8,000 members. Our fellow member Armin Šepić together with Silvia Chakarova (Urban Practitioners Network within the Sustainable Living Spaces Cluster of BAN) submitted a proposal **"UPN meets Sarajevo: Spaces on the crossroads"** where among 60 proposals from all over the world was one of the five selected projects and the only selected in Europe. The workshop took place from 28th September to 1st October in Sarajevo.

The Urban Practitioners Network (UPN) was established within the Bosch Alumni Network in 2021 under the Sustainable Living Spaces **2020 Call for Ideas**. It is a space for common support and sharing of innovative practices between motivated professionals who care for the quality of the urban environment. After a successful bonding event in Bodrum in 2022 and strengthening the community of urban practitioners from different backgrounds and with a variety of professional expertise, this year it was organized in Sarajevo, Bosnia– Herzegovina.

Altogether 14 participants from Bosnia–Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Germany, Poland, Romania, Turkey, the UK, and the USA had a main challenge to rethink the Olympic bobsleigh track and its surroundings, its place in the present, but also possible development in the future.



Only 7 minutes from the Old Town by the cable car a concrete structure tells the stories of happiness and tragedy at the same time, looking for its place in the future. The workshop was sequenced in fieldwork and working sessions in a very beautiful venue of the **Olympic** <u>**Museum**</u>. After the presentation of the Museum, history of the XIV Winter Olympics, and their future plans by director **Senka Ibrišimbegović** and watching documentary movie Souvenirs of War by Bosch alumni Georg Zeller, participants split into three groups according to their professional or topic preference. Many ideas were born and this cooperation will continue in the future, so stay tuned.

This fruitful event wouldn't be possible without **Bosch Alumni Network** and <u>International</u> <u>Alumni Center Berlin</u>, but also without the local support of our EFB alumni Dajana Džindo and her <u>Foundation 787</u>.
